

Two step approach:

- ❖ 1st step: submission of a short Expression of Interest
(and if successful)
- ❖ 2nd step: submission of a complete Application Form

Call budget: approximately **60M EUR** (ERDF, IPA, ENI)

Max project duration: **30 months**
